WHAT IS GIRI TRAINING?


GIRI has worked with the construction industry to develop an accredited training scheme that directly targets the underlying **root causes of error**, which currently cost the UK industry an estimated £25 billion every year.

This training empowers companies, project teams, and individuals to **get it right first time**. During development, these courses were stringently tested to ensure they deliver maximum impact on error reduction and productivity for the construction industry.

The courses were developed **by industry, for industry**, and can play a significant part in helping to reduce the frequency and cost of error in construction by ensuring all industry workers develop the right skills to collaboratively understand, pre-empt, and avoid error in their daily work.

- Training across interfaces

Who is it for?

Organisational leadership teams.

Course objectives

A full-day interactive course for leaders of construction organisations to: understand the consequences and common root causes of error; identify personal actions to eliminate error within their organisation, projects and teams; and define group actions to improve processes and communication to systematically eliminate error within the organisation and throughout the planning and delivery of construction projects.

This training empowers leadership teams to set the culture and conditions for error avoidance on their projects and enable the embedment of all other GIRI training throughout the wider organisation.

STRATEGIES TO ELIMINATE ERROR FOR LEADERS OF CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS – PART ONE

Who is it for?

Project leadership teams.

Course objectives

A full-day interactive course for leaders of construction projects to understand the consequences and common root causes of error; identify personal actions to eliminate error within their projects and teams; and define group actions to improve processes and communication to systematically eliminate error throughout the planning and delivery of construction projects.

This training empowers leadership teams to set the conditions for error avoidance on their projects and enable the embedment of all other GIRI training throughout the wider organisation.

The training should be followed by 'GIRI PL-02 Strategies to eliminate error for leaders of construction projects - Part two' at four to six month intervals and major project milestones to review progress and update action plans, based on the results of previous sessions.

- an improved awareness of leadership behaviours that will reduce error
- improved understanding of processes and how these relate to error
- improved understanding of effective communication
- · improved ability to pre-empt error on projects

STRATEGIES TO ELIMINATE ERROR FOR LEADERS OF CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS – PART TWO

Who is it for?

Project leadership teams.

Course objectives

A full-day interactive training course for leaders of construction projects to: understand the consequences and common root causes of error; identify personal actions to eliminate error within their projects and teams; and define group actions to improve processes and communication, to systematically eliminate error throughout the planning and delivery of construction projects.

This training empowers leadership teams to set the conditions for error avoidance on their projects and enable the embedment of all other GIRI training throughout the wider organisation.

This training should be repeated at four to six month intervals, and at major project milestones, to review progress and update action plans, based on the results from previous training workshops.

- improved understanding of error, in relation to organisational leadership
- an improved awareness of leadership behaviours that will reduce error
- improved understanding of processes, and how these relate to error
- improved understanding of effective communication
- improved ability to pre-empt error on projects
- identify personal actions to reduce error
- agree a group action plan to counter optimism bias and prevent error

Pre-requisites

Whilst there are no pre-requisites, this course is designed as a follow up to 'GIRI PL-01 Strategies to eliminate error for leaders of construction projects – Part one' and will reflect on the content of the previous session for the project.

AVOIDING CONSTRUCTION ERRORS AT INTERFACES PART ONE: COLLABORATION

Who is it for?

Multi-disciplinary project teams.

Course objectives

A half-day session that provides participants with an appreciation for the scale of error in the construction industry and an understanding that interfaces are a common root cause of error. The course develops participants' ability to identify various forms of interfaces on their projects and provides practical skills and techniques to improve the management of interfaces to avoid error.

Learning outcomes

- improved understanding of error
- improved understanding of interfaces
- improved awareness of good practice in managing interfaces
- improved communication skills in relation to construction projects
- a personal action plan identifying actions to reduce the likelihood of errors at interfaces.

Renewal

The certificate is valid for three years.

GIRI IN-02 AVOIDING CONSTRUCTION ERRORS AT INTERFACES PART TWO: DESIGNING FOR CONSTRUCTION

Who is it for?

Personnel with particular responsibility for managing design.

Course objectives

A half-day session focusing on methods to avoid errors at design interfaces. This course provides an appreciation for the scale of error in the construction industry and an understanding that design interfaces are a common root cause of those errors.

The course develops participants' ability to identify design interfaces, provides an understanding of good practice in relation to managing design interfaces, and then enables participants to develop an action plan defining key measures to improve their management of design interfaces in order to avoid error.

Learning outcomes

- improved understanding of error
- · improved understanding of design interfaces
- improved awareness of good practice in managing design interfaces
- identify key measures to improve management of design interfaces
- an action plan defining key measures to avoid errors at design interfaces

Pre-requisites

Participants should have attended 'GIRI IN-01 Avoiding construction errors at interfaces - Part one: Collaboration' within the last 12 months.

Renewal

GIRI SM-01

REDUCING ERRORS ON CONSTRUCTION SITES PART ONE: SUPERVISION SKILLS

Who is it for?

Supervisors, managers, and designers with a responsibility to consider construction.

Course objectives

This half-day session is the first part of a two-part course. This first session enables course participants to understand the origins and impact of errors in construction; understand the root causes of error; recognise behaviours which can lead to error; select and apply appropriate methods of supervision; select and employ effective methods of communication to confirm understanding; apply the 'build it in your brain' model and the 'press pause to avoid error' model, and be able to explain how these techniques can help eliminate error in their daily work.

Learning outcomes

- improved understanding of error
- improved supervisory skills
- improved communication skills

Renewal

The certificate is valid for three years.

GIRI SM-02

REDUCING ERRORS ON CONSTRUCTION SITES PART TWO: PLANNING SKILLS

Who is it for? As above.

Course objectives

This half-day session is the second of a two-part course. It enables participants to: relate the root causes of error to their daily work; understand the importance of effective planning to avoid error during construction; apply various techniques to effectively capture project information; develop and validate practical plans; demonstrate effective communication of design information and construction plans; develop an individual action plan to improve planning and avoid error.

Learning outcomes

- improved understanding of error
- improved planning skills
- individual action plans identifying key measures to improve planning and avoid error.

Pre-requisites

Attendees should have completed the 'GIRI SM-01: Reducing errors on construction sites - Part one: Supervision skills' course within the last 12 months.

Renewal

The certificate is valid for three years.
